These values are important to the organization from the individual member all the way up to the CEO and the International President. Here are the core values of Toastmasters International:


RESPECT to the Individual – We need to be respectful of the opinions, efforts and values of all of our fellow toastmasters, club officers, and district officers. This respect of the individ-




The sessions were well received, as we held main sessions on club officer roles, Working the Program, Successful Contests and Moments of Truth.


